# **IMPORTANT REMINDERS**

SUN PROTECTION: Children must wear a Kids Cottage hat during Kids Cottage hours. All children will receive a Kids Cottage hat free of charge on their first day of attendance. New hats are available for purchase from the office if necessary. If a child does not have their Kids Cottage hat, we will provide them with a spare hat. Please note that use of spare hats does incur a \$1 laundry fee each time your child uses one. If your child refuses to wear a spare hat, they will be required to remain indoors funtil at least 4:30pm as per our sun protection policy.

SIGN IN/OUT: All parents/guardians/grandparents/carers collecting children from Kids Cottage must be authorised to do so. All authorised persons will have their own sign in/out account and need to use their own account each time they drop off or collect a child. If another parent or a grandparent or someone is collecting just one time, please let the centre know by emailing the office on info@kidscottagemiddleharbour.com. If a non-authorised person comes to collect your child, we will ring you for permission before allowing them to remove the child from our care. Please make sure we are aware of any carpool situations for sports & extracurriculars – we must have permission in writing for anyone other than one of your authorised collectors to pick up your child from Cottage including other Middle Harbour/Kids Cottage parents.

# What to Watch out for in Term 1

We are inviting all Kids Cottage Families to join us on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> February from 7:30am to 8:30am for a welcome breakfast. The welcome breakfast allows new and old families to meet our staff and join your child/ren for a yummy breakfast and see how the before school care program runs. If you would like to attend, please let either Jacqui or Imogen know. If your child is not booked in for Before School Care, you're welcome to book them in, or they can stay with you until 8:30am then they will go to school.





On Thursday morning, we now have a footy clinic which is run by NSW Rugby Girls/ Women's Development Officer. The clinic is running for all children booked in to before school care from 7:30am to 8:30am. There is no additional charge for the clinic, your child just needs to be booked for before school care to attend. The clinic will be running all term and we welcome all to join in on the fun. The program focuses on children's sporting abilities.

Harmony Week, this year we will be celebrating Harmony Week from 16<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> March. We will be programming and running different crafts, cooking activities and sporting games from different cultures within Kids Cottage. ### **KIDS CLUB AT KIDS COTTAGE**

We recognise that children in Years Four, Five and Six may have a different set of needs or expectations for before and after school care. We cater for these differences with the privilege of participation in our Kids Club. You may notice that your children in these older years have a few privileges unique to Kids Club such as the ability to go to the Canteen after eating afternoon tea for a small treat, out-of-bounds games such as "Capture the Flag" throughout the entire school grounds, special Kids Club "chill out" areas with self-directed activities and BP points, which they can accumulate for a variety of fun prizes including a staff supervised trip to the local BP station for a small treat or even the chance to be a "Staff Member for the Day!"

One of the goals we have for our older children at Kids Cottage is for the children to feel supported to regulate their own behaviour and learn how to communicate effectively to resolve conflicts with their peers.

At the start of each school year, children in years 4 to 6 and their staff work together to define the Kids Club expectations, consequences and rewards. This year the Kids Club children and staff created a behaviour agreement based on these agreed upon expectations. We believe that this behaviour agreement provides the children with an opportunity to be responsible and accountable for their own behaviour. You received an email on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> February from Kalani, the Kids Club group leader with the behaviour agreement. We encourage you to read through it with your child(ren) and return it by Monday 17<sup>th</sup> February. It needs to be signed by both a parent and the child(ren).

We are excited to continue to program challenging, fun activities for our older children and are looking forward to a great year with our Kids Club children.
